

### **2025 SUMMER READING HIGHLIGHTS**

Over 55 kids PreK-Gr 5 expressed their creativity this summer, actively reading and playing a fun humanities-themed version of our summer reading game, with a total of 1,604 days read, an average of 28 days read per child.

We hosted several programs for children and their families, including comedy magic by Justin

- Painting was very "poplar" with several threedimensional seasonal tree crafts using puzzle pieces, and kids discovered and decorated fossils.
